## **WIC Program Goals**

#### **Federal Requirements**

- A 2014 audit conducted by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) required immediate programmatic changes in the following areas:
  - Vendor training and monitoring
  - Vendor compliance with state and federal regulations
  - Information systems
  - > Participant access criteria
  - Price reasonableness/competitiveness




## **New WIC Check Appearance**

- Effective April 4, 2015:
  - The Maximum Allowable Reimbursement Level (MARL) (aka the Not-to-Exceed (NTE) amount) will be removed.
- Benefits
  - Promote price competitiveness
  - Improve WIC shopping experience for participants and vendors
  - Minimize WIC participant and vendor disagreements that occur during the WIC transaction over food prices and MARL/NTE




### **Current WIC Check Appearance**





#### **New WIC Check Appearance:** Effective April 4, 2015



## **Suppression of MARLs/NTEs**


- The MARL/NTE will still be in place during the processing of the check
- Will not be visible to participants and vendors on the face of the check
- Vendor must write in the amount of the WIC transaction prior to the participant signing and dating the check





## **Suppression of MARLs/NTEs**

- Checks issued prior to April 4, 2015 will include the NTE amount
- Vendors may continue to see WIC checks with an NTE through July 2015





# Process for handling checks that exceed MARLs/NTEs

- WIC checks exceeding NTE amounts will initially be rejected by the WIC banking contractor
  - > NYS will not impose any fees for checks that exceed the NTE
- Checks rejected because they exceed the Blind NTE will automatically be paid at the regional area average via ACH transaction
   No additional action is required by the vendor
- > Bank fees may be assessed by the Vendor's Bank of Deposit.
  - Vendors are encouraged to contact their Bank of Deposit for details and negotiate options for waived fees and/or a 90 day grace period

#### **Establishing Not to Exceed Amounts**

- NYS DOH will continue to monitor redemption values relative to established MARLs/NTEs and may consider modifications to NTEs as necessary
- Over the next 18 months, a revised system for establishing MARLs/NTEs will be developed to promote cost containment and price competitiveness
- Criteria will include vendor shelf prices, market fluctuations, geographic location and store size



## Upcoming WIC Benefit Changes



#### **Enhanced Vegetable and Fruit Benefit**

- WIC participants will temporarily be provided Enhanced WIC "Vegetables and Fruits Checks" also known as with Cash Value Vouchers (CVV)
- CVVs are used as a health promotion, obesity prevention strategy to increase vegetable and fruit consumption among WIC participants
- CVVs may be used to purchase Fresh/Frozen/Canned Vegetables and/or Fruits
- Participants are allowed to "pay the difference" if sale exceeds the check amount



#### **Enhanced Vegetable and Fruit Benefit**


CVV amounts will increase by \$4 for certain food packages: children, pregnant women, fully breastfeeding women

≻CVVs will contain more than one dollar amount to reflect the \$4 increase

Participants are allowed to redeem the check for the value of all dollar amounts



#### WIC Vegetable and Fruit Checks: Upcoming Changes



- 1. Not To Exceed (NTE) amount will be removed.
- WIC check will contain more than one dollar amount to reflect the temporary \$4 increase in funds.
- 3. Participants are allowed to redeem the check for the value of all dollar amounts.

### **WIC Infant Formula**

- Formula in the WIC program is classified in two ways:
  - Contract (aka Standard Formula)
    Non-Contract (aka Exempt Formula)
- New York State WIC currently contracts with Mead Johnson for iron-fortified standard formulas

### **Exempt Formula Policy**


#### Effective February 1, 2014:

- Only authorized WIC pharmacies and retail WIC vendors with a pharmacy inside may cash WIC checks for exempt formula.
  - Exempt formula is identified as any product on the "Approved Formulas in the New York State WIC Program Formulary" list other than the four contract formulas
  - Includes: Boost, Boost High Protein, Boost Kid Essentials, Ensure, Ensure Plus, PediaSure



## **Exempt Formula Policy**

- Effective November 1, 2014:
  - New message appeared on "Exempt Formula" checks
  - "This WIC check may only be cashed at an approved WIC pharmacy or WIC store with a pharmacy inside the store."





#### **WIC Infant Formula**

WIC formula must be purchased from a supplier who is approved by the NYS WIC Program

### Suppliers/Wholesalers

- Vendor Applicants must provide the WIC Program with:
  - Primary grocery wholesaler and infant formula supplier(s)
  - Proof of purchase from this/these supplier(s)
- If this information changes during the course of the contract, notify the VMA within 15 days of the change

#### **Check Cashing: Exempt Formula**

- Effective April 4, 2015:
  - WIC banking contractor will reject payment to unauthorized vendors for exempt formula checks
  - Vendors must submit a copy of pharmacy license to VMA by February 27<sup>th</sup>, in order to continue accepting WIC checks for Exempt Formula



#### **Check Cashing: Exempt Formula**

- Any exempt formula checks redeemed in violation of WIC Program Policy may be subject to recovery of funds paid, civil monetary penalties, or disqualification
- Bank fees from the vendor's bank of deposit may also be incurred



## Record Keeping



## **Vendor Recordkeeping**

- All WIC vendors must maintain invoices and purchase slips of all food purchases (including formula) for a period of three years
- > An acceptable invoice or purchase slip must contain:
  - Name/address of the supplier/wholesaler
  - Name/address of the purchasing store
  - Date of purchase
  - An accurate description of the item (ex. stock number/UPC/size)
  - Quantity purchased
  - > Unit price
  - Total cost



#### **Vendor Recordkeeping**

- Invoices must be prepared entirely by the wholesaler or retailer from whom the WIC vendor made the purchase
- Invoices/receipts for infant formula must be from an approved infant formula supplier

### **Vendor Recordkeeping**

- Records must be made available to the NYS DOH and Vendor Management Agencies (VMAs) upon request
- Vendors not in compliance with these record-keeping requirements may be subject to recovery of funds, civil money penalties, or disqualification from the WIC program



## Changes in Ownership



## **Changes in Ownership Status**

- WIC Vendors are required to report any and all changes in ownership to the VMA 30 days in advance of the change
- WIC Vendor authorization is not transferrable to new store owners or business entities
- New store owners and business entities must complete the WIC Vendor Application process and be authorized by the NYS WIC Program to accept WIC checks



# **Changes in Ownership Status**

- Common examples of a change in ownership include, but are not limited to:
  - Store is sold to a new owner
  - Sole owner Incorporates or becomes a Partnership
  - Partner is added or removed
  - New Federal Employer Identification Number (FEIN) is assigned



# Proposed WIC Regulatory Changes

## **NYS WIC Vendor Regulations**

- Federal WIC regulations, Section 246.12 (g) require that States develop and implement vendor selection and enrollment criteria
- Current criteria in NYS has resulted in the authorization of more vendors than necessary to ensure participant access and program integrity



## **NYS WIC Vendor Regulations**

Proposed changes to NYS regulations (Sections 60-1.1 and 60-1.13 of Title 10 of the Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York) will revise criteria to determine an appropriate number of vendors needed to ensure participant access



# **Rulemaking Process:**

Proposed Rule

NYS publishes the proposed regulatory language

#### Public Comment

- Allows the public to submit written comments to DOH within a prescribed timeframe
- DOH reviews and responds to public comments and may modify proposed regulatory language, if necessary

#### Final Rule

NYCRR is amended upon publication of a Notice of Adoption in the New York State Register



# Vendor Applications



#### **Vendor Applications**

- Vendor application processes will be revised if/when NYS Regulations change
- Business as usual until such time



#### **Vendor Applications**

- Influx of applications in the last 4 months has resulted in a significant backlog
- The NYS Department of Health performs background checks on vendor applications
- Applications are being reviewed on a first come, first served basis
- Applications will not be expedited unless a demonstrated need for participant access exists as determined by DOH
